### Day 1 Read 2 Samuel 1:17-27

This is a lament for those who have fallen in battle.

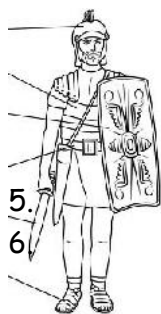
1. Who is writing this lament? For whom was it written?
2. Why do you think the men of Judah were ordered to be taught this lament?
3. How can we honor the memory of our soldiers who have fallen?

### Day 2 Read Psalm 91

This Psalm is a Psalm of protection. For today, use this Psalm to write a prayer for any soldiers or public servants you know who may be in harms way.

### Day 3 Read Ephesians 6:10-18

Whatever your view of the military, the reading for the next three days are passages that use war, soldiering/military and combat as analogies for the life of faith. In today's passage, the Apostle Paul uses the Roman soldier's uniform to describe what the Christian should be "wearing".



1. According to this passage, against whom are we fighting?
2. What are the 6 pieces of armor mentioned?
3. What do you think the fiery darts or flaming arrows of the evil one are?
4. What is the Sword of the Spirit? How can it help you fight the enemy?

### Day 4 Read 2 Corinthians 10:3-5

This passage points out that we do not wage war as the world does.

1. How do we demolish arguments and every pretension that sets itself up against the knowledge of God?
2. What is it important to take our thoughts captive and make them obedient to Christ?

### Day 5 Read 2 Timothy 2:1-4

In this passage, Paul encourages us to endure hardships like a soldier.

1. How does a soldier endure hardships?
2. Who is our commanding officer?
