Lost And Found

Day 1 Read 2 Kings 6:1-7

I just love that our amazing God included this passage in His word to us!

1. Why do you think God included this in scripture?
2. What is the most precious thing you have ever lost and then found again?

Day 2 Read 1 Samuel 9:1-20

In this passage we see that sometimes God uses our loss for a bigger purpose.

1. What did Saul’s father send him to do?
2. What did the servant encouraged Saul to do?
3. What do you think this passage tells us about God?

Day 3 Read Luke 15:1-7; Ezekiel 34:15-16, 21-22

The interpretation of the passages we will read in Luke 15 for the next three days depends on verses 1 and 2.

1. Who was attracted to Jesus in verses 1 and 2? Does this surprise you?
2. What was the reaction of the religious leaders to Jesus’ associations?
3. How many sheep did the man in this parable have? How many did he leave behind?
4. Name two things that you find striking about this passage?
5. What analogy is used to describe God in these passages?

Day 4 Read Luke 15:8-10

This parable is clearly linked to the parable of the lost sheep.

1. How many coins did the woman lose?
2. In what manner does she look for what is missing?
3. What does the fact that she got a lamp to help her search tell us about her determination?

Day 5 Read Luke 15:11-32

In this parable of the prodigal son, we see even a greater glimpse of God’s grace than in the previous passages.

1. What did the younger son ask his father to give him.
2. What made the younger son want to go back to his father?
3. Have you ever wandered so far from God that you thought he wouldn’t welcome you back
4. List at least four things the father did to show his love for the returning son?
5. How has this study encouraged you to pray for the lost?
