

## **"JUST SAY KNOW" BIBLE STUDY**

### **Valley of a Vision**

Throughout the Bible, great battles were fought and won in the Valleys. Hopefully this study will encourage you to look at the Valleys of our life differently.

#### **Day 1 Read 1 Samuel 17:1-30**

This passage takes place in the Valley of Elah, where King Saul and the Israelite Army had been in a 40 day standoff with the Philistines.

1. Draw a picture of what verse 3 might have looked like.
2. Describe Goliath.
3. What was the response of Saul and his army? (V. 11)
4. Why was David at the Battle Scene? What was his response to hearing Goliath? (V.26)

#### **Day 2 Read 1 Samuel 17:31-58**

1. Why does David tell Saul he is able to fight Goliath? (Vs. 34-37)
2. Who brought David victory in this otherwise extremely unbalanced matchup? (Vs. 45-46)  
For what reason? (V. 47)

#### **Day 3 Read 2 Chronicles 20:1-30**

Here is another important passage of victory in the Valley!

1. What 3 things did Jehoshaphat do when he was told a vast army was coming against him?
2. Did his response affect those around him?
3. How did God answer Jehoshaphat's prayer? (Vs.15-17)
4. What Battle advice did Jehoshaphat give his army? (V. 20)
5. When Judah's army got to the battle, what did they find? What happened?
6. What did they name this valley where the battle took place?
7. What lessons can we learn from this passage?

#### **Day 4 Read Ezekiel 37:1-6**

Ezekiel was trained and educated to be a priest in the kingdom of Judah from his early youth. What he envisioned his life would be was completely quashed when the Babylonians invaded Judah and took the Jews into captivity. But God brought hope to the captives in the Valley of Dry Bones!

1. Who put Ezekiel into the Valley?
2. What unusual objects were in the valley? How does the Bible describe the objects? Why is this significant?
3. Are there visions or dreams in your life that are seemingly dead? Do you believe they can be resurrected?
4. What was the Word of the Lord spoken over the bones?

**Day 5 Read Ezekiel 37:7-14**

1. What was Ezekiel commanded to do? Was he obedient to *God*?
2. What happened to the bones when he prophesied? What was missing?
3. What happened when he prophesied for the 'Breath' to come?
4. What were the bones saying according to verse 11? *God* can transform and bring hope, victory and life to the impossible!
